


Senior Ties

All pupils will get a card when we return in September.

They have to get every member of their teaching staff to sign it before giving it to their form tutor who will also sign. Last port of call is the appropriate Head of House who will have more of an overview and sign if they agree.

We are monitoring from the start of lockdown so anything you have done (or not done!) during this time will be taken into account.

Once completed, ties can be collected from Mr Daley in his office on Wednesday form times **ONLY** up to the end of term. Ties can be worn straight away.

After conducting pupil voice with year 10, senior holders get to:


Have various trips depending on pupil voice during the Christmas, Easter and summer terms.

Any other ideas regarding rewards are very welcome




Senior Ties

Anything above a C4 means pupils lose their senior tie and revert back to a 'normal' one. Obviously any one-off 'misdemeanours' will also result in removal of the tie.

To get the senior tie back, you will need to get the card signed all over again and present to Mr Daley as before.

Ties must be 'earned' **by Christmas** and anyone without a senior tie at **Easter** will not go to prom.
