Peace of mind, safeguarding & wellbeing

Kingswood creates and maintains an inspiring and adventurous environment that allows us to have a positive impact on the lives of young people, whilst protecting them from harm.

Safety & Staff

- All Kingswood staff are vetted, inducted and trained to the highest levels.
- All staff complete a comprehensive induction programme that includes safeguarding training.
- Throughout their employment with Kingswood all staff are monitored to ensure compliance with our health and safety procedures.

All activities have rapid access to first aid trained staff and facilities

- Instructors are trained to recognise each individual child's own capabilities and teach to his/her individual level and pace.
- All staff wear identification badges and uniforms at all times, with all visitors and teachers required to wear a security badge.

Safety & Standards

- Every Kingswood centre is independently inspected by the British Activity Providers Association (BAPA).
- We also conduct rigorous internal health and safety audits.
- We operate comprehensive risk assessments on all activities.
- We are fully responsible for all emergency procedures, safety systems and security arrangements at each centre.

Safety & Supervision

- For most activities children are placed into groups of no more than 15.
- Our strict supervision policy ensures that children are always accompanied by Kingswood instructors. Between 9.00 pm and 9.00 am and at meal and break times they are supervised by their teachers. Teachers are in loco parentis throughout the visit.
- Kingswood campuses have secure and clearly defined boundaries. Some centres have CCTV in operation.
- Teacher and party leader rooms are situated close to their students.
- The Kingswood Duty Manager and first-aiders are on call 24 hours a day.

Safeguarding & Wellbeing

- We employ designated safeguarding trainers, and we have committed to having Designated Safeguarding Leads to provide 24 hour cover.
- We give all our employees, party leaders and site visitors badges so you can easily identify them. We adopt a 'challenge no badge' policy and all of our centres have a sign in/sign out process, plus coded gates with intercoms.
- We actively encourage young people to voice any concerns and to never be afraid to ask for help.





Packing Checklist

Please use the following checklist to help pack bags:

- One bath towel
- Toiletries bag containing: toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, hairbrush etc
- Night clothes
- Socks and underwear
- Four t-shirts, shirts, blouses (at least one with long-sleeves), sweatshirt (two in winter)
- One thick sweater plus one light sweater
- Three pairs of trousers and/or jeans and/or tracksuit bottoms
- Clothes for the evening activities
- Waterproof jacket (and trousers if you have them)
- Sturdy shoes or wellingtons (even in summer)
- Two pairs of trainers (one old pair)
- Large plastic bag for dirty clothes
- Water bottle
- Hat and sunscreen (in spring and summer)
- We recommend advising your young people to bring some money with them (no more than £10) in case they would like to make a purchase in our centre shop. Our shops sell snacks and drinks, as well as postcards, souvenirs, games and mementos.

*Please note that most activities require long sleeves.

Please do not bring

Student Conduct

Whilst we fully expect the trip to run smoothly and hope that everyone has a great time, we have also reminded students that any negative conduct during the trip will not be tolerated.

We still expect high expectations of our students and for them to choose the correct behaviour choices.

Any student who **persistently** fails to follow instructions of Kingswood or Huntcliff staff, and poses a risk to their own or others health and safety, parents will be notified.

Should the behaviours continue parents will be asked to collect their child. They will no longer be able to stay on the trip and refund will not be issued.

Home sickness – although away for a short period of time, should any student feel unsettled and not able to stay for the duration, parents will be contacted.





Contact and use of mobile phones

As stated on page 7 ideally mobile phones should remain at home. However, we are realistic and are aware that this is how we would expect students to keep in touch especially on departure day.

Students who wish to bring a phone may do so but under clear instructions of staff. *

Phones should **remain in their room** for the duration of the trip and **will not be allowed** during any activities

They will be able to **use their phones** on the coaches, and to make contact if needed on an evening during their 'down time'

Whilst you may want to keep in touch with your child, we often find that this can distract them from the experience and would only ask you to contact if **absolutely necessary**

We will keep parents informed via our facebook page and we will make sure plenty of pictures are taken (with student consent first) so memories of their time at Kingswood can be shared at a later date

<u>Sleeping</u> Arrangements

Students will be placed in dormitories with beds and bunk beds.


Rooms can hold between 4 and 8 students

These will be allocated before the day of departure

Students will be asked who they wish to share with and best efforts to place them with their preferred friendship groups. (*They must NOT swap rooms, this is for health & safety reasons, fire list and to make sure we can account for all students*)

Staff are placed in between student rooms to monitor and be available if needed. Kingswood night duty staff are also on hand if needed.

Activities usually end at 9pm. After a light refreshment, students will head back to dorms. Lights out no later than 10pm we have busy and early starts!

Frequently asked questions

What experience does Kingswood have in working with schools and groups?

Kingswood has been delivering high-quality residential education programmes to schools for over three decades. Our teams currently reach over 165,000 young people every year from UK and international schools and non-school groups. All instruction is given by our team of professionally qualified outdoor educators, supported by a strong centre management team. We constantly review our programmes so we can quickly respond to the changing needs of nonschool groups and the educational needs of an ever changing curriculum.

Will children need additional pocket money?

All children's needs are catered for but every Kingswood centre does have a gift shop where children can buy postcards, limited refreshments, pencils and souvenirs so we recommend young people to bring £5-10 during their stay. You can also purchase souvenirs.

What are your accommodation arrangements like?

All of our dormitories are gender separated and sleep between 2 to 16 in bunk beds in each room. Sheets, duvets and pillows are provided. Some rooms are ensuite but there are always separate toilet and shower facilities for girls and boys close to dormitories.

Can parents telephone their children?

In special circumstances, of course. However, it has been our experience that parents phoning their children just to talk often makes the children's time away from home harder, rather than easier.

What care is available during the night?

Teachers and party leader rooms are located nearby to young people's dormitories so that they are never too far away in case care is needed. Every centre has a night duty team on call throughout the night.

What is included in the booking price?

Your booking price covers: fully supervised centrebased programmes and evening entertainment, comfortable accommodation and freshly prepared, healthy meals.

When is bedtime?

Our evening activities typically end around 9pm when students enjoy a refreshment before returning to their dorms. We suggest a lights-out policy of 10pm but this may vary depending on the age of the group and their teachers' preferences.

Can you arrange insurance?

All visitors to Kingswood are covered by our standard £5 million public liability insurance while on site. Some schools also prefer our additional comprehensive group travel insurance at £3 per individual. This covers children and party leaders from the time of booking your Kingswood visit to your return to school.

Will my child cope?

All Kingswood staff are trained to take responsibility for the well-being of the children who are in their care. We have found that the best way to help children cope with being away from home is to keep them busy. As such, we create a warm, supportive environment for students so they quickly feel at home. Our activities are progressive, allowing students to join in at whatever level they're comfortable with. For obvious reasons some activities are age restricted and/or subject to the correcting of equipment.

What about children with special needs?

Kingswood is committed to an inclusive approach and values the involvement of all young people. We can support special needs students with many of their requirements as long as teachers make us aware of them at the time of booking. We're happy to provide extra support to those who are used to taking part in activities with the rest of their classmates – but if we think it won't prove a positive experience for them, that it might prove overwhelming, or that we're not equipped to cope with a specific situation, we'll let you know.

What's the food like?

Our breakfast, lunch and dinner menus are all created to boost energy, with health in mind and meet government recommendations on nutrition. Menus vary day-to-day according to the season but there is always a choice of hot and cold dishes, vegetarian options and fresh salad bars, with meals served in communal dining areas. We're happy to cater for special faith or dietary requirements if we are informed well in advance. You can view a sample menu in this pack or online ahead of your child's trip.

Will our child mix with others from different schools or groups?

Our centres usually have several schools and groups staying at any one time, but children will all stay together throughout the day. The only time groups can meet is in the evenings as part of our Social Sundown unless participating in the Interaction module. Students from different schools never share the same dorms.





STUDENT FAQ's



- Can we play music and sit in each others rooms? During downtime you may, music can be played quietly. You will be given warning when to return to your own room for lights out.
- Do we have screen time? Yes during your breaks and downtime. However, you will be busy so won't need your phones as much as you think!
- Can we bring snacks? Yes, but please do not each on the coach. Do not bring an
 excessive amount! There is s shop to buy snacks too. Energy drinks <u>NOT</u> allowed
- What time is bed time? Evening activities finish at 9pm, you get a light snack and lights out at 10pm.
- How many people per room, can we pick? Between 4-8. Dorms are min 4, some are 6 others 8. We will sort rooms soon and you will be asked who you want to share with. However, not following staff instructions or being noisy we will spilt you up and move you!
- How long do we have for a shower? You will be given plenty of time to get up, showered, dressed and breakfast. You will be told this on the day. I would suggest giving yourself an hour we will make sure you get up on time and have time to do what you need
